From the Director:

Dear Ashby,

In last month's Scoop I reported to you on the top questions I'm asked as your COA Director. The number one question by far is "how many seniors are there in Ashby?". Based on the most recent numbers from the State received just this week, Ashby's total population over the age of 65 is significantly more than I reported to you last month.

According to the State's latest estimate, there are roughly **587** Ashby residents over the age of 65. That's roughly **19%** of our total population. There are another **323** Ashby residents between the ages of 60 and 64. Based on today's total population of Ashby, in 5 short years, the number of seniors in town will rise to **29%!** Ashby is not alone - the senior population in Massachusetts is soaring. All cities and towns in Massachusetts are having to reevaluate their priorities, including their budget priorities.

Your COA is tasked with meeting the needs of Ashby's growing senior population in order to help them age in place. More seniors equals more needs. More needs equal more resources required to meet those needs. In practical terms it means we need more COA services in Ashby: more volunteers for services like Meals on Wheels and sand delivery, more newsletters to keep everyone informed and more volunteers to help fold them, more MART trips to be scheduled, more home visits, more friendly visits, more medical equipment, more space to accommodate senior events, and so on. All of this requires more time and money.

The job of the COA Director is to coordinate all the things listed above and much more. The Director position is currently given only a total of 8 hours a week to do all of this, which is clearly not enough time to serve the senior population now, or in the next 5 years. Demographics are a changing in Ashby, and we need to direct our attention to our senior citizens. To that end, the COA has requested that the town focus more funds on our senior citizens by increasing the COA budget by \$6,527 for fiscal year 2020. This amount will allow your Director 16 hours a week to serve you, it will allow the COA to double its office hours each week, and it will allow the COA to continue to offer programs and services to the growing Ashby senior population.

However, it will not happen without your support! Please let your Board of Selectmen and your Finance Committee know that you support the use of town funds to increase the COA's budget so we can continue to provide services to all of Ashby's seniors! Thank you all for your continued support!

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNCIL ON AGING:

The number of senior citizens (age 65+) in Ashby has significantly increased since the last U.S. census from roughly 10% to almost 19% of Ashby's population today. By 2024, Ashby's senior population is projected to reach 29% of the total population:

Total Ashby Residents: 3095
Total resident over the age of 65: <u>587</u>
Total residents between ages 60 to 64: <u>323</u>

Your Ashby COA members have requested a budget increase for fiscal year 2020 (July 2019 to May 2020) in order to meet the ongoing and increasing needs of Ashby's senior population. The increase will allow your COA to extend the working hours for the COA Director position to 2 days per week, allowing us to double our open office hours, and ensuring the continuation of crucial COA programs for all Ashby seniors including: the Senior Scoop Newsletter, Meals on Wheels, MART transportation, Senior Sand Delivery, Friendly Visitors Program, the Outreach Program, and senior informational seminars and trips.

The Ashby Board of Selectmen and the Finance Committee are in the process of finalizing Ashby's budget for vote at our Annual Town Meeting in May. The COA asks that all Ashby citizen attend the upcoming meetings of the Board of Selectmen and Finance Committee to let them know you support the COA budget increase. If you are not able to attend a meeting, we ask you to write your Board of Selectmen and Finance Committee to voice your support. Ashby P.D. Tip of the Month: Winter Driving and Emergency Vehicle Kit

The Ashby Police Department has the following tips for vehicle maintenance and emergency supplies:

- Check your tires and make sure you have adequate tire tread depth before the first winter storm and check tire pressure during cold weather. Remember, tire shops and mechanics are busiest just before and during winter storms.
- Get a vehicle winter maintenance check-up. Don't wait to check your battery, belts, hoses, radiator, lights, brakes, heater/defroster and wipers.
- Keep your fuel tank full don't let it fall below half a tank on winter trips.
- Keep a basic winter emergency kit in your vehicle. This may include: flashlight, batteries, blanket, snacks, water, gloves, boots, first-aid kit, tire chains, ice scraper/snowbrush, jumper cables, road flares.
- Please give enough space for other vehicles and stopping distance during winter conditions. Drive appropriate for weather conditions and make sure to clean the snow off your vehicle. Remember: It's always better to be prepared and not need it, then to need it and not be prepared.
